8. INFORMATION ON THE SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN POLAND

8.1. Criterion of access to higher education

The total duration of the educational cycle until completion of a school offering the possibility of taking the secondary school leaving examination (maturity examination) is 12 – 15 years. Having successfully passed the secondary school leaving examination (maturity examination), graduates are awarded a secondary education certificate, which entitles them to apply for admission to a higher education study programme.

8.2 The system of higher education

The grounds for the functioning of the higher education system are laid down in the Act of 20th July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (Dziennik Ustaw – Journal of Laws, item 1668 as amended). Public institutions of higher education are established by a state authority. Study programmes are offered in the form of first-cycle, second-cycle or uniform long-cycle degree programmes. Study programmes may be offered as full-time or part-time study programmes.

Full-time first-cycle degree programmes last at least six semesters, or – if the programme curriculum includes learning outcomes enabling obtaining engineering competences, – at least seven semesters. Full-time second cycle degree programmes last from three to five semesters. Full-time uniform long-cycle Master's degree programmes last from nine to twelve semesters.

Study programmes offered in the part-time mode may last longer than the corresponding programmes offered in the full-time mode.

Qualifications obtained by completing a study programme within the system of higher education are assigned specific levels of the Polish Qualifications Framework defined in the Act of the 22nd December 2015 on the Integrated System of Qualifications (J. o L. 2018, item 2153 as amended).

The diploma awarded upon completion of a first-cycle programme confirms the award of the full qualification of the sixth level in accordance with the Polish Qualifications Framework.

The diploma awarded upon completion of a second-cycle programme and the diploma awarded upon completion of a uniform long-cycle Master's degree programme confirm the award of the full qualification of the seventh level in accordance with the Polish Qualifications Framework.

8.3 Degrees awarded to graduates of higher education study programmes

- 1) licencjat, inżynier and equivalent degrees: inżynier architekt, inżynier pożarnictwa, licencjat pielęgniarstwa, licencjat położnictwa, – degrees awarded to graduates of first-cycle programmes,
- 2) magister, magister inżynier and equivalent degrees:
 - a) magister inżynier architekt, magister inżynier pożarnictwa, magister pielęgniarstwa, magister położnictwa – degrees awarded to graduates of second-cycle programmes,
 - b) lekarz, lekarz dentysta, lekarz weterynarii, magister farmacji, magister inżynier architekt – degrees awarded to graduates of uniform long-cycle programmes.

8.4 ECTS credits

In order to be awarded a diploma confirming completion of a first-cycle programme, the student is obliged to earn at least 180 ECTS credits, a minimum of 90 ECTS credits are required for completion of a second-cycle programme, at least 300 ECTS credits for completion of a uniform long-cycle programme lasting 9 or 10 semesters and 360 ECTS credits for completion of a uniform long-cycle programme lasting 11 or 12 semesters.
